

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Rowan pupils can be put themselves forward to be part of our School Council. School council is a group of young people from across the school who can pass on ideas on how to make the school better to our leadership team.

We hold an election- if you are voted in you help to make decisions about the school –this could be school uniform or helping to interview members of staff.

School Council hold regular meetings which you must attend, speak at and feedback to the rest of Rowan.



MEDICATION and First Aid

We know that sometimes accidents can happen, which is why all Rowan staff are first aid trained.

Sometimes you need medication in school, we will store this for you and give you your medication at the times it is prescribed.

If you are feeling unwell always let an adult know and they can help.





COMPLAINTS

If you are unhappy about something you have the right to make a complaint. We take this very seriously.

You can:

•Talk to a member of staff

•Fill out a complaints form, which will go to Mrs Hughes

•Talk to a member of the senior management team

After you have made a complaint, someone will speak with you and let you know what is happening to sort out your complaint



OFSTED

It is Ofsted's job to check the places where children and young people are looked after and check on the people who look after them. High Close is one of these places

Ofsted want to make sure everyone is doing the best job they can and are helping make people's lives better.

School inspections take a few days to complete and inspectors will spend time asking questions and talking to young people and staff.



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
